Students have the option to qualify and compete for contract ng as a cadet in ROTC to become eligible to commission as an of cer in the U.S. Army af er select on and complet on of an undergraduate degree.

Students who enroll in any military science course incur no military obligat on. Basic level courses are conducted in the same manner as are other courses taught at the University.

Students entering into the advance course must be of high moral character and meet required medical, apt tude, and GPA requirements. In addit on, if contracted as a cadet, students must sign an agreement to fulfill any obligat ons and a military service requirement in either the Reserve Component, or Act ve Army upon complet on of ROTC and graduat ng from Murray State. This will not be valid if a cadet is disqualif ed, disenrolled, or not selected for commissioning as an of cer; however, some obligat ons may remain.

The two-year program is designed for transfer students and Murray State students who qualify to earn a commission as an Army of cer or want a minor without a military obligat on, but did not part cipate in the four-year program. Students desiring to part cipate in the two-year program must gain credit for basic military science courses. This credit can be awarded to students who are veterans, Nat onal Guard and Reserve personnel that have completed Basic Training. Also, college students who qualify and contract as cadets with at least two years remaining in college, may gain credit for basic military science courses by complet ng an ROTC leadership pract cum (MIL 210) at Fort Knox, Kentucky, conducted each summer. Students part cipating in MIL 210 must meet screening height and weight standards, pass an entrance level Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT), entrance medical exam, and have the approval of the chair of the Department of Military Science.

The two year minor is the advanced military science course. All students entering into the advance course must be of high moral character and meet required medical, apt tude, and GPA requirements. Non-contracted students may obtain a minor in military science without a military service obligat on. Contracted cadets, students must sign an agreement to fulfill any obligat ons and a military service requirement in either the Reserve Component, or Act ve Army upon complet on of ROTC and graduat ng from Murray State. This will not be valid if a cadet is disqualif ed, disenrolled, or not selected for commissioning as an of cer; however, some obligat ons may remain.
